Articles and notes should observe the following standards: Times New Roman font, size 12, double spaced, and footnote citation format that conforms to the 18th edition of *The Bluebook*.

With the expectation of forging long-term ties between the School, the Journal, and practitioners, as well as to facilitate the writing process, our editors are available to aid with research tasks.
